	As has been said previously speed limits along A525 have been assessed and new limits have been
	implemented over recent years, as part of WCBC's review of all speed limit on A and B class roads.
	It is therefore only on completion of this work that other routes and locations within the County
	Borough, inclusive of A525, will be considered for further speed limit reduction works.
	For your information the speed limit review programme is now in its final year.
21 Sep	Stakeholder Reference Group Meeting - 5th September 2016:
	Welsh Ambulance Service Trust (WAST) - Mrs Sonia Thompson, Interim Head of Operations,
	provided the Group with a presentation regarding current initiatives within the Ambulance Trust.
	It's worth bearing in mind that this is an 'All Wales' service and not one which is only applicable to
	North Wales.
	(attached is a copy of the presentation for your information but want to pick up on two points):-
	The first is the proposed 'Hear and Treat' initiative which is currently in its development stage. The
	idea behind Hear and Treat is to undertake an 'assessment of need' prior to the despatch of an
	ambulance, or other vehicle, following the receipt of the initial telephone call. Rather than simply
	despatch an ambulance more or less automatically, a telephone triage assessment will be
	undertaken with the caller to determine whether or not an ambulance is the appropriate method
	of response or if a more cost effective and patient centred response can be applied, such as a
	paramedic type vehicle. It was suggested that service users need to be properly apprised of what's
	going on when a call is received in that the overwhelming majority of callers will expect to hear "an
	ambulance is on its way." The aim is to launch the service before the end of October 2016.
	The second relates to an ongoing pilot scheme currently operating in Denbighshire known as the

	Community Assistance Team. This is centred around service users who are classed as 'non-injury fallers'; a person who has fallen over but shows no sign of visible injury. In such cases the response may involve the despatch of a vehicle equipped with appropriate lifting gear to help the
	faller back to their feet, whilst ensuring that they have suffered no other trauma. Some 26 cases have been logged since 1st August last and all have been successfully handled by the Team. No decision has yet been made as to when, or if, the scheme will be rolled out to other areas. Much will depend upon the continuing success of the pilot and securing sufficient funding to allow for expansion.
	Communications and Engagement - Mrs Katie Sargent, Assistant Director of Corporate Communications, and Mr Rob Callow, Interim Head of Engagement, gave a presentation on how communication with and engagement of service users is being developed. Here again, a copy of the presentation is attached for your information. One of the core features of the developments is the on-line initiative entitled 'Get Involved'. Places statutory duties on local authorities to make certain information available electronically with a regularly updated website providing the public with the ability to access the information as detailed below.

The Act requires Community Councils to have websites which are to contain the following:-

- to publish notices and papers electronically
- to publish their register of members interests electronically
- information how to contact the clerk
- list of Council's members, contact details, party affiliation (if any) and any office or committee held within the Council. If the community is divided into community wards the ward for each member represents must be shown
- whether the council member has been co-opted or elected
- minutes of the meetings
- annual audited accounts

Councils can operate their own independent website or link up with other Community Councils in the their area or the Principal Council or independent body that will host their site
