# <u>Meeting with Ray Parry – Monday 30<sup>th</sup> July</u>

I met with Ray Parry this afternoon. Update as below regarding repair of equipment at the play area:-

No.	Item	Action Required	Recommendations / Action
1.	Multi Play Equipment	Various actions were recommended in the Annual Report – including replacing the rotting timber of the equipment and covering up the foundations which are exposed and topping up with fresh bark.	Ray Parry inspected the equipment and found most of the posts will need to be replaced now and others in about 12 months time. It would cost a lot to dismantle the equipment, remove the posts and the concrete then to replace all the posts and set in new concrete and reassemble the equipment. The current equipment is approximately 20 years old. It would make sense to replace the existing equipment. In addition, the flooring will need to be replaced, options include:- • Rubber safety matting; • Turf with a grass mesh / webbing; • Bark (this quite possibly contributed to the rotting of the posts of the current equipment as it is damp at the site) Ray Parry is to provide costings for replacing the equipment and the flooring options.
2.	Rocking Equipment	The seat is severely damaged and requires replacing	Ray Parry to provide quote to replace seat.
3.	Swings	Wear to seats and chains	Ray Parry to provide quote to replace seats and chains.
4.	Roundabout	The grass mats are silted up, the soil is compacted and the area will become very slippery when the soil is wet. Recommended to lift and relay the mats. Concerns regarding the gap between the equipment and ground.	Ray Parry has advised that a bearing has gone – he is to quote to replace it. It is not possible to lift and relay the mats as they will fall apart when doing so. He suggested that the area round the equipment is concencreted to build it up to the recommended gap and to provide a rubber safety matting.
